**Undesignated gifts allow us to apply the funds wherever the need is greatest.**

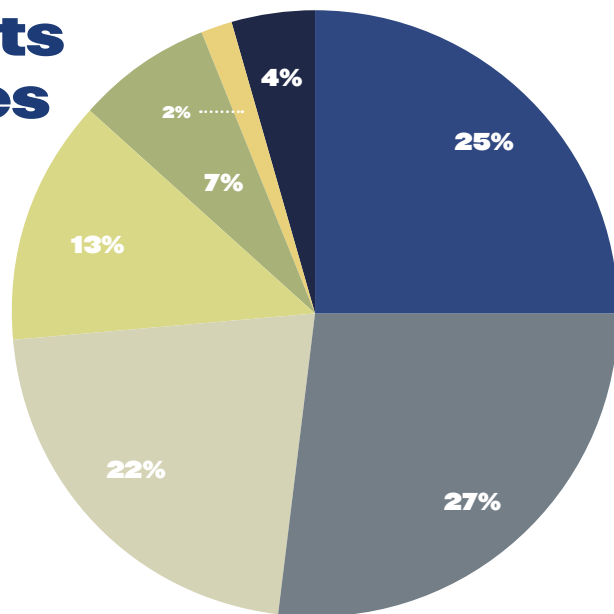


### **Krittika Bhattacharjee (2009),**

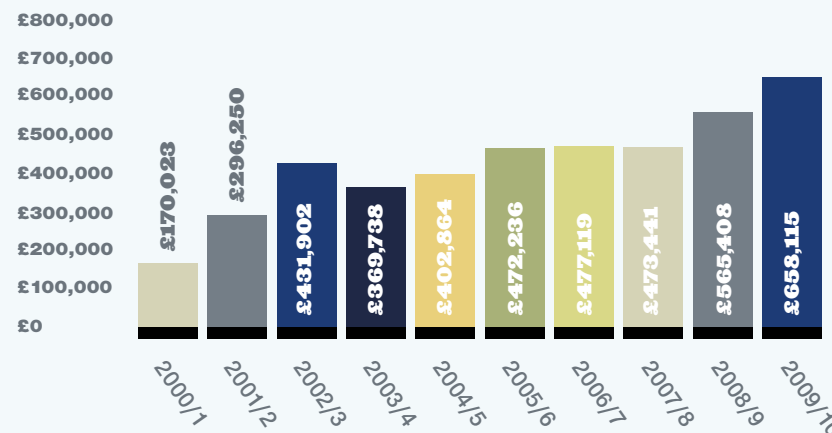

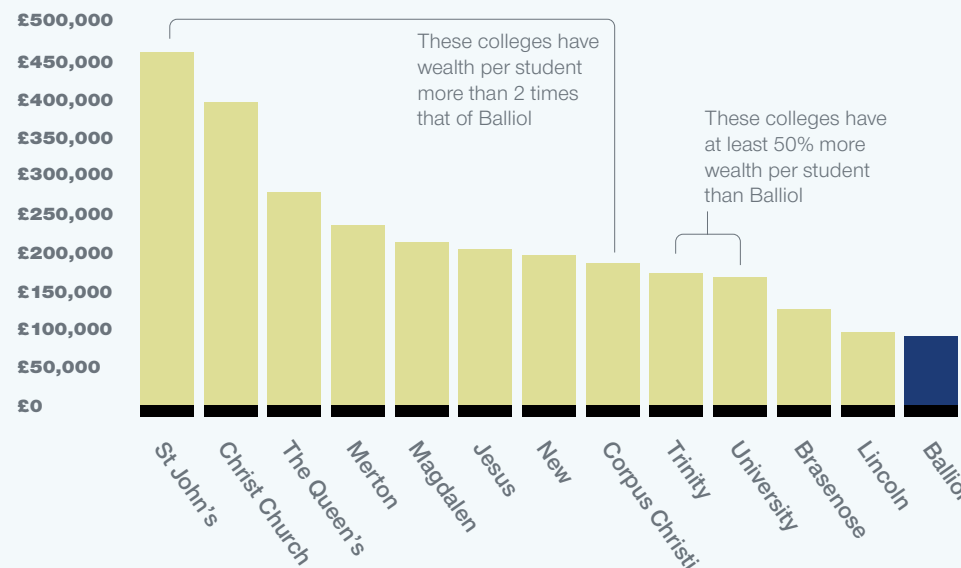
