



THE FOLEY-BEJAR SCHOLARSHIP

The College seeks to elect a Foley-Béjar Scholar. Candidates will have an offer of admission to Oxford University and a place at Balliol College to read for a higher degree commencing in the academic year 2024/25. The Scholarship is open only to candidates who (a) were born in or who have a parent born in Mexico, Spain, or the Republic of Ireland, or who have a strong connection with Northern Ireland; and (b) have been resident for 5 years or more in Mexico, Spain or the Republic of Ireland. There are no special restrictions as to the subject or degree for which the Scholar reads.

The Scholarship may be awarded in conjunction with a [University Clarendon Fund](#) award. If the Scholarship is awarded alone, its value will be up to £15,500 per annum.

Awards are made for the full duration of the period of fee liability for the agreed course, subject to satisfactory academic progress being made, and are tenable only at Balliol College.

Applicants must apply to the University of Oxford for admission to a higher degree by the relevant course scholarship deadline (see <https://www.ox.ac.uk/admissions/graduate/fees-and-funding/oxford-funding>). No separate application is required to be considered for this award.

*Candidates who wish to be considered on the basis of a **parent's nationality** or **because they have a strong link to Northern Ireland** must inform the Balliol College Graduate Administrator of this as soon as they learn they have an offer of a place from Oxford University.*

Otherwise all eligible applicants (i.e. those with relevant nationality or who are resident (and have been for at least 5 years) in Mexico, Spain, or the Republic of Ireland) will be considered automatically as this will be flagged from the information given on their application.
