Balliol College Oxford is delighted to invite applications for the Balliol Students' Scholarship, which intends to support a student ordinarily resident in the UK with either refugee status or leave to remain in the UK on the grounds of humanitarian protection, in studying for an undergraduate degree at the University of Oxford commencing October 2018. The recipient will need to qualify for 'home' fee status according to Category 9 or 10 of the [UK Council for International Student Affairs](#). This fully-funded Scholarship is supported by the generosity of undergraduate and postgraduate students at the College, the Governing Body of Balliol College, and alumni and other donors. The Scholarship is a student-led initiative that aims to provide a talented undergraduate with the opportunity to study for a degree without disruption, so that they can achieve their full academic potential.

Balliol College

Balliol College is a thriving academic community in the heart of Oxford. It exists to advance education at both undergraduate and graduate levels, to facilitate and to encourage scholarship and research at the very highest levels, and to promote excellence in learning, as one of the colleges within the University of Oxford.

Founded in 1263, Balliol is one of Oxford's oldest colleges; the oldest academic institution in the English-speaking world still on its original site; and almost certainly the oldest co-founded by a woman anywhere. Balliol is also a very international college at the undergraduate, postgraduate and fellows' levels, with approximately 22% of the most recent intake of undergraduates coming from outside the UK.

We offer a superb academic environment and a vibrant, supportive and inclusive community. The College is located in the heart of historic Oxford and houses an excellent library as well as other facilities and resources including sports grounds. What does the Scholarship cover?

The Scholarship covers:

- Full tuition fees
- Full maintenance award (£9,021 – 13,237 per annum). This amount is sufficient to cover accommodation and food costs as well as other general living costs.

What Course May I Apply For?

Applicants may apply for any three or four-year course which Balliol College offers at undergraduate level except for Medicine. This course must be full time leading to a qualification. If you wish to apply for Medicine, please contact Victoria Holt, (whose email address is below), as partial funding may be possible.

Am I Eligible?

Candidates are expected to have excellent grades and to have met, or be predicted to meet, the minimum academic entry requirements for their chosen course (see the 'Requirements' tab for your chosen course at www.ox.ac.uk/courses). Consideration will be given to the specific challenges that may arise for refugee students in terms of presenting a complete academic transcript, but every effort should be made to give as much information as possible.

Candidates must also satisfy one of the English language conditions listed at www.ox.ac.uk/englang. If you have not achieved the required grade in a listed qualification at the time of application, this will form part of any conditional offer that you might receive and must be met by 31 July 2018 for entry in October 2018.

Candidates should be ordinarily resident in the UK with either refugee status or leave to remain in the UK on the grounds of humanitarian protection, and must qualify for 'home' fee status according to Category 9 or 10 of the [UK Council for International Student Affairs](#).

How Do I Apply?

We first ask that you complete the Balliol College 'Expression of Interest' form here: <https://goo.gl/forms/idYMba1KJZdSsXeQ2>, in order to signal to the College your wish to apply for this Scholarship. This will also make you eligible for funding assistance if required for the application process. A full university application must then be submitted through the UCAS system.

UCAS

UCAS is the online system used by all UK universities to process their undergraduate applications. All applicants must apply for a place through the online UCAS website, and Balliol College will consider eligible applicants for the Scholarship. Please ensure you apply for Balliol (code O on the UCAS system) on your UCAS application.

You need to register on the UCAS system before completing an online application. The online application can be commenced from 1 September 2017, but you can register on UCAS well before this date and are advised to do so. There is a UCAS application fee of £12 (for applicants applying to one university) payable online with a debit or credit card. If you are unable to pay this fee, please note this on your initial Expression of Interest form, as financial support and/or credit card assistance may be arranged.

Personal Statement: you are invited in the personal statement section to explain why you are applying for the course and why you are suited to it. We advise you to concentrate on your academic abilities and potential rather than extra-curricular pursuits.

Reference: applications are invalid without an academic reference so please ensure that you ask someone to write a reference for you well in advance of the application deadline. The referee should write about your academic abilities and potential and suitability for the course. We recognise that there may be difficulties in obtaining a reference from a school teacher, in which case a UNHCR official or equivalent refugee aid worker could complete this reference if they can attest to your academic interest and aptitude. This potential referee should contact Balliol College's Undergraduate Admissions and Academic Administrator, Victoria Holt, by email at undergraduate@balliol.ox.ac.uk if they have any questions about what is required.

The deadline for your application to be submitted online via UCAS (including the academic reference) is strictly 6pm UK time on **15 October 2017**. No applications received after this date will be considered. You are strongly recommended to give yourself sufficient time to complete your application, including collecting references, paying your application fee and resolving any queries so that your application can be sent to us before the relevant deadline passes.

If you are not registered for the test by the deadline you will not be able to sit the test and your application is unlikely to be considered further.

If there are substantial barriers that would prevent travel to an established test centre, please contact Victoria Holt, undergraduate@balliol.ox.ac.uk, as far in advance of the 15 October registration deadline as possible. We will endeavour to support alternative arrangements where possible.

Written work

Shortlisting and interviews

Once the tutors have received all UCAS applications, aptitude test results, and written work they assess each applicant. The College will invite all applicants we wish to consider for a place to for an interview. At this stage, all applicants are notified of whether they are to be invited for an interview or whether their application has been unsuccessful.
