



THE SNELL SCHOLARSHIP THE SNELL EXHIBITION

The College seeks to elect one Snell Scholar and one Snell Exhibitioner. Candidates will have an offer of admission to Oxford University and a place at Balliol College to read for a higher degree commencing in the academic year 2021/22, having already completed a degree at the University of Glasgow. Applications are invited from good Honours graduates of the University of Glasgow, or from students in their final Honours year at the University of Glasgow who hope to graduate with a first or good upper second class degree.

The Scholarship may be offered in conjunction with an award from any of the [UK Research Council](#) funding bodies, with a preference for the [UK Arts and Humanities Research Council Doctoral Training Programme Studentship](#). In exceptional circumstances, the Scholarship may be made as a stand-alone award. If the Scholarship is awarded alone, its value will be up to £15,000 per annum for the duration of fee liability.

The Exhibition may be offered in conjunction with an award from any of the [UK Research Council](#) funding bodies apart from the Arts and Humanities Research Council. In exceptional circumstances, the Exhibition may be made as a stand-alone award. If the Exhibition is awarded alone, its value will be £3,300 per annum for the duration of fee liability.

This award is made for the full duration of the period of fee liability for the agreed course, subject to satisfactory academic progress being made, and is tenable only at Balliol College.

Applicants must apply to the University of Oxford for admission to a higher degree by the University's second deadline in January. No separate application is required to be considered for this award.
